PETITION TO THE SECRETARY OF THE INTERIOR FOR A RULEMAKING TO WITHDRAW CERTAIN FEDERAL LANDS AND MINERALS IN COLORADO, MONTANA, NEVADA, UTAH, AND WYOMING FROM OIL AND GAS LEASING

I. <u>INTRODUCTION</u>

Conservatives for Responsible Stewardship (CRS) files this petition under the Administrative Procedure Act (APA), which provides "interested person[s] the right to petition for the issuance, amendment, or repeal of a rule."¹ The rule requested by CRS pertains to 81 parcels on 116,980 acres of federal land and minerals that the Bureau of Land Management (BLM) recently and unsuccessfully sought to lease for oil and gas development.² CRS requests that pursuant to the APA, as well as section 204 of the Federal Land Policy and Management Act (FLPMA), the Secretary of the Interior issue a rule formally withdrawing these parcels from future oil and gas leasing pending the completion of further land use planning.³

Over the past few months, the Interior Department has directed its bureaus and offices to make "energy dominance" their highest priority. This paradigm shift in the management of our public lands, which is contrary to the "multiple use" and "sustained yield" mandate of FLPMA, is unnecessarily endangering places where Americans hunt, fish, and camp with their children, and that provide drinking water for nearby communities. "Energy dominance" is harming, rather than enhancing, the well-being of everyday Americans.

While some of these places have been spared, it was not because the Interior Department changed its priorities, but rather because the oil and gas industry opted not to purchase the leases offered by BLM. In fact, since this administration came to office, BLM has offered approximately 12.7 million acres of public lands for lease, but only 1.3 million acres (11 percent) have sold. Thus, in addition to placing our natural and cultural heritage at risk, the administration is wasting a tremendous amount of taxpayer resources on ill-conceived and under-performing oil and gas lease sales.

This petition, then, is intended to underscore the flaws of the administration's so-called "energy dominance" approach to managing our public lands and begin restoring "multiple use" and "sustained yield" to their lawful place as the guiding principles of public lands management. While the specific parcels identified below deserve to be withdrawn from future leasing based on their value and importance to sportsmen, local communities, motorized recreationists, and other public land users, they are also emblematic of the broader problem with "energy dominance:" millions of acres of sensitive public lands are being included in oil and gas leases, even though there is little apparent demand from the oil and gas industry.

All of the lands discussed in this petition have significant value to the public for reasons other than oil and gas development. And now that the oil and gas industry has chosen not to lease them, the BLM, consistent with its true mission of "multiple use" and "sustained yield," must formally evaluate whether they should be managed for other purposes.

II. INTERESTS OF CONSERVATIVES FOR RESPONSIBLE STEWARDSHIP

CRS is a national, non-profit, grassroots organization founded on the premise that environmental stewardship and natural resources conservation are inherently conservative, and that the true conservative will be a good steward of the natural systems and resources that sustain life on earth. As such, we have approximately 15,000 members nationwide who visit and recreate on America's public lands. CRS and its members have a strong interest in ensuring the responsible management and stewardship of these shared assets. We seek to foster a better understanding of conservatism's stewardship requirement and advance public land policies that are smart, efficient, fiscally responsible, and economically sound.

By advancing our mission, we stay true to the genuine conservatism—articulated by Edmund Burke and promoted by great American conservative leaders from Theodore Roosevelt to Ronald Reagan—that instructs us to rise above lesser instincts and pure self-interest to leave a better world for our children and grandchildren.

The work we do enhances the health and well-being of everyone. It helps safeguard the air we breathe, the water we drink, and the special places that refresh and inspire us. It strengthens our society by encouraging balance between freedom and responsibility. It strengthens our nation by promoting sustainable economic growth and helping ensure that we do not squander our natural wealth.

III. FACTUAL BACKGROUND AND CONTEXT FOR THIS PETITION

A. "Energy Dominance" Now "Highest" Priority for BLM.

On March 28, 2017, President Trump issued Executive Order 13,783 ("Promoting Energy Independence and Economic Growth").⁴ This order requires federal agencies to "identify" and "rescind" rules and policies that "unduly burden the development of domestic energy resources. . . ."⁵ In response to E.O. 13,783, Secretary Zinke issued Secretarial Order 3349 ("American Energy Independence"), which initiated a sweeping departmental review of "all existing regulations, orders, guidance documents, policies, instructions, notices, implementing actions, and any other similar actions" to determine whether they did, in fact, burden energy development.⁶ This review culminated in the release of a report on October 24, 2017 (i.e., the "Burdens Report"), which recommends far-reaching regulatory and policy changes "to eliminate or minimize regulatory burdens" on energy development and "[t]o ensure energy policies receive the highest level attention across Interior. . . ."⁷

E.O. 13,783 and S.O. 3349 both target "energy independence." However, Secretary Zinke quickly rebranded this effort, and, by May 1, 2017, was instructing his bureaus and offices to pursue so-called "energy dominance."⁸ This is now the "highest" priority for BLM, which has aggressively

embraced its new mission, stating, "[g]oing into the new year, we remain committed to an era of American energy dominance...."

B. BLM Issues New Oil and Gas Leasing Policy; NEPA and Public Participation Now Optional.

On January 31, 2018, BLM issued a new oil and gas leasing policy (Instruction Memorandum (IM) 2018-034), as recommended by the Burdens Report.¹⁰ Two of the policy's main objectives are to "streamline the leasing process to alleviate unnecessary impediments and burdens" and to "expedite the offering of lands for lease...."¹¹ IM 2018-034 aims to achieve these objectives by overhauling the leasing process, including by:

- Eliminating explicit recognition that "there is no presumed preference for oil and gas development over other uses": BLM prior's leasing policy confirmed that "there is no presumed preference for oil and gas development over other uses."¹² This language merely restated the multiple-use requirement of FLPMA.¹³ As federal courts have explained, "[i]t is past doubt that the principle of multiple use does not require BLM to prioritize development over other uses."¹⁴ Because IM 2018-034 did not include this language, it suggests that there is now, in fact, a preference for oil and gas development on public lands.
- Making NEPA compliance optional for oil and gas lease sales: Complying with NEPA is no longer required for BLM lease sales, as IM 2018-034 encourages the use of "Determinations of NEPA Adequacy," which are not NEPA documents and are of questionable legality when used to authorize oil and gas exploration and production activities on public lands. As a consequence, BLM is not required to develop and evaluate a range of alternatives for proposed lease sales or mitigation measures that could avoid or minimize potential impacts on wildlife habitat, recreation resources, water supplies, and other multiple-uses of the public lands.
- Making public and stakeholder participation optional for oil and gas lease sales: In addition to making NEPA compliance optional, IM 2018-034 also provides the public and stakeholders, such as state fish and wildlife agencies, with no guaranteed right to participate in the lease sale decision-making process, aside from a truncated, ten-day protest period.¹⁵
- **Eliminating rotational lease sales:** BLM will no longer rotate lease sales among its field offices, a process previously used "to balance the workload and to allow each field office to devote sufficient time and resources" to completing NEPA reviews and public and

stakeholder outreach.¹⁶ Instead, BLM "will offer all parcels determined to be eligible and available within the state office's jurisdiction."¹⁷

C. BLM Ramps-Up Leasing, But Millions of Acres Not Selling.

As a direct outgrowth of "energy dominance" and a suite of new streamlining policies, including IM 2018-034, BLM has included increasingly more acreage in its quarterly lease sales. For example, in October 2017, BLM announced the "largest" lease sale ever within Alaska's National Petroleum Reserve, a sale which Secretary Zinke claimed would "help achieve our goal of American Energy Dominance."¹⁸ Additionally, there are currently over 2 million acres proposed for September and December 2018 lease sales.¹⁹

Yet, an increase in acreage offered has not led to an increase in acreage leased. In fact, in 2017, BLM offered over 11.8 million acres in quarterly oil and gas leases, but only 791,000 acres – or 7 percent – sold. This is less than the total amount of acres leased in 2016 (908,000), when BLM offered just 1.9 million acres for sale. Notably, the poor returns under so-called "energy dominance" are not confined to a single state, as less than 51 percent of offered acres sold in Alaska (< 1 percent), Montana (26 percent), Nevada (11 percent), and Utah (51 percent). This trend has continued in 2018, as, outside of Wyoming, BLM has sold less than 38 percent of the acreage offered at quarterly sales.²⁰

IV. <u>"ENERGY DOMINANCE" VIOLATES FEDERAL LAW: CONSERVING FISH AND WILDLIFE</u> <u>SPECIES, HISTORIC AND CULTURAL RESOURCES, AND OPEN SPACES MUST RECEIVE</u> <u>EQUAL CONSIDERATION.</u>

The administration's so-called "Energy dominance" approach to land management has no basis in federal law, which devotes our public lands to "multiple uses" and "sustained yield" and limits leasing to places where oil and gas resources are likely to be found.

A. FLPMA does not allow for "energy dominance."

1. FLPMA requires multiple use management, not the "dominance" of one use over any other.

FLPMA's mandate is straightforward: manage public lands "on the basis of multiple use and sustained yield...."²¹ "Multiple use" means

a combination of balanced and diverse resource uses that takes into account the long-term needs of future generations for renewable and nonrenewable resources, including, but not limited to, recreation, range, timber, minerals, watershed, wildlife and fish, and natural scenic, scientific and historical values; and harmonious and

coordinated management of the various resources without permanent impairment of the productivity of the land and the quality of the environment with consideration being given to the relative values of the resources and not necessarily to the combination of uses that will give the greatest economic return or the greatest unit output.²²

And "sustained yield" means "the achievement and maintenance in perpetuity of a high-level annual or regular periodic output of the various renewable resources of the public lands consistent with multiple use."²³ Taken together, these twin-pillars of public lands management affirmatively prohibit BLM from actively managing for a single, "dominant" use, including and especially oil and gas development. Federal courts have firmly rejected such efforts in the past.²⁴

2. BLM is not fulfilling its obligation to achieve "fair market value" for the commercial use of public lands.

FLPMA also requires that the American public "receive fair market value of the use of the public lands and their resources...."²⁵ It is self-evident that when 12.7 million acres of public lands are offered for lease and only 1.3 million acres actually sell, these lands are not being put to their highest and best use. Whatever that use may be, it is clearly not oil and gas development.

3. BLM cannot "exclude" principal uses of the public lands without first notifying Congress.

Perhaps envisioning a scenario such as this, where BLM actively works to make one use "dominant" over all others across the public lands, Congress declared that

[a]ny management decision or action pursuant to a management decision that excludes (that is, totally eliminates) one or more of the principal or major uses for two or more years with respect to a tract of land of one hundred thousand acres or more shall be reported by the Secretary to the House of Representatives and the Senate. If within ninety days from the giving of such notice (exclusive of days on which either House has adjourned for more than three consecutive days), the Congress adopts a concurrent resolution of nonapproval of the management decision or action, then the management decision or action shall be promptly terminated by the Secretary.²⁶

Yet, to the best of our knowledge, the Interior Department has never notified Congress of its efforts to enshrine energy development as the "dominant" use of public lands. Thus, the BLM is carrying out a program which has not been properly presented to Congress for mandatory review and oversight.

B. BLM is engaging in speculative leasing, contrary to requirements of the Mineral Leasing Act.

Contrary to the requirements of the Mineral Leasing Act (MLA), BLM is routinely offering parcels without any evidence that marketable oil and gas resources actually exist beneath them. Under the MLA, BLM may only offer for lease "lands . . . which are known or believed to contain oil or gas deposits. . . .^{"27} For example, in Wyoming BLM's March 2018 oil and gas lease sale, BLM offered five leases surrounding Fort Laramie National Historic Site, a unit of the National Park System. According to BLM, these leases are located in an area with "very low" development potential.²⁸ Nevertheless, and even though "[t]he superintendent of the Fort Laramie National Historic Site identified concerns with oil and gas development in proximity to the Historic Site", BLM included the leases in the sale. (They did not sell).

Similarly, in Nevada BLM's June 2018 oil and gas lease sale, BLM failed to generate any bids on several leases that overlap with mule deer winter range and migration corridors. These leases are situated in the Battle Mountain District Office, which "is rated as very low for development potential . . . with a low probability for any wells being drilled. . . . "²⁹ These are just two examples of much broader efforts by BLM to encourage speculative leasing, a practice inconsistent with the purpose and requirements of the MLA.

V. <u>BLM MUST WITHDRAW 81 PARCELS ON 116,980 ACRES OF FEDERAL LANDS AND</u> <u>MINERALS, PENDING THE COMPLETION OF ADDITIONAL LAND USE PLANNING.</u>

In light of the foregoing authorities, which affirmatively reject the basis for "energy dominance" and related policies, including IM 2018-034, we request that the Secretary of the Interior issue a rule formally withdrawing the parcels identified below from future oil and gas leasing.³⁰ Each of these parcels was offered – but did not sell – at recent oil and gas lease sales. We further request that the withdrawal remain in force at least until BLM completes additional land use planning for each of the parcels in question. Doing so would allow BLM, through coordination with the public and interested stakeholders, to determine whether these parcels should remain available for leasing in light of industry's lack of interest or should be managed for other purposes, including hunting and fishing, conserving open space, and protecting drinking water sources.

The specific justification for withdrawing each of the parcels is set forth below.

A. Parcels in Big Game Habitat and Trout Streams

These parcels are located in big game habitat, including migration corridors, and/or alongside trout streams. Withdrawing them from future leasing would avoid the impacts of development on sensitive big game species and enhance hunting and fishing opportunities. Doing so would also

further compliance with Secretarial Order 3362, which directs BLM to "avoid[] development in the most crucial winter range and primary migration corridors" and "minimize[] development that would fragment winter range and primary migration corridors...."³¹

B. Parcels in Popular Recreation Areas

These parcels are located in areas specifically designated or otherwise managed with a focus on recreation. Withdrawing them from future leasing would ensure that these areas continue to provide high-quality recreation experiences for current and future generations. Doing so would also further compliance with Secretarial Order 3366, which directs BLM to enhance recreation opportunities on public lands.³²

C. Parcels in Drinking Water Source Areas

These parcels are located in areas that provide drinking water for local communities. Withdrawing them from future leasing would ensure that these communities continue to have access to clean supplies of drinking water and avoid the risk of spills and contamination from oil and gas activities.

D. Parcels by National Monuments

These parcels are located just outside the boundaries of Basin and Range National Monument. Withdrawing them from future leasing would ensure the ongoing protection of the monument's "objects of historic and scientific interest," which include a "vast, rugged landscape" and "unbroken expanse" that provides "important habitat for game species including desert bighorn sheep, mule deer, Rocky Mountain elk, and pronghorn."³⁸

E. Parcels in Greater Sage-Grouse Habitat

These parcels are located in habitat designated for the protection of Greater sage-grouse. Withdrawing them from future leasing would help "prioritize" oil and gas leasing outside of this habitat, as required by BLM's sage-grouse conservation plans, and would also help avoid the need to list sage-grouse under the Endangered Species Act in the future.³⁹

Pursuant to Department of Justice policy, notice is hereby given that, on May 18, 2009, a proposed Consent Decree in In re James Pielet, Case No. 06-01026 (Bankr. N.D. Ill.) and In re J.P. Investments, Inc., Case No. 06-01037 (Bankr. N.D. Ill.) was lodged with the United States Bankruptcy Court for the Northern District of Illinois. The Consent Decree provides for recovery of response costs that the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency ("EPA") has incurred and will incur in addressing environmental contamination at two sites: the Midwest Metallics Site in Summit, Illinois and the H&H Enterprises Site in Gary, Indiana. The United States has asserted a claim against the J.P. Investments bankruptcy estate for \$5,087,276 in costs associated with the Midwest Metallics Site and it has asserted a claim against the James Pielet bankruptcy estate for \$3,210,411.66 in costs associated with the H&H Enterprises Site.

The proposed Consent Decree would resolve the United States' claims in the two bankruptcy cases in exchange for providing EPA: (i) A \$700,000.00 allowed secured claim against the James Pielet bankruptcy estate, to be paid on a priority basis pursuant to 11 U.S.C. 725; (ii) a \$2,510,411.66 allowed general unsecured claim against the James Pielet bankruptcy estate; (iii) a \$3,391,517.33 allowed general unsecured claim against the J.P. Investments bankruptcy estate; and (iv) a \$1,695,758.67 allowed general unsecured subordinated claim against the J.P. Investments bankruptcy estate.
